In 1784 son Matthew sold the land on Clear Creek, therefore son William's land must have been on Reedy Creek. In 1797 Andrew Miller, subject of this family group, sold the land on Reedy Creek proving he was William's son. This clarification is necessary because William left no will and the grandfather Andrew Miller had two or more grandsons named Andrew.

NOTES

1. Although the surname "Wilson" for the wife of Andrew Miller is not technically proven, besides Reference 7 cited above it was well known throughout the family in succeeding generations.
2. Reference 7 above states that "Andrew and Jane (Wilson) Miller reared nine children." According to the 1800 and 1810 censuses of Lincoln County, NC, cited above there must have been seven daughters and two sons [son William having been born subsequently in 1812]. The unnamed female child in this Miller family may have been Betsy Miller who married Frederick Hager in Lincoln County, NC, 14 October 1809 (See p. 53, reference 15 above). On 27 November 1818 a Frederick Hager married Margaret Hinkle, so it is possible that if this Betsy Miller was a member of this family she was deceased by the time the Andrew Miller family made the move to Missouri.

NOTES

1. It is possible that Elizabeth Rutledge was the second wife of Andrew Miller and not the mother of all his children. According to the will of Matthew Rutledge, brother of Elizabeth (See reference 8 above), Elizabeth was still "Elizabeth Rutledge" at the writing of his will in 1748. Two of Matthew's other sisters were referred to by their married names. By the time Elizabeth's father, Isaac Rutledge, wrote his will in May 1760 (See reference 9 above), Elizabeth and Andrew Miller were married, indicating Elizabeth Rutledge and Andrew Miller married between 1747 and 1760.
2. Although the surname "Wilson" for the wife of Andrew Miller is not technically proven, besides Reference 7 cited above, it was well known throughout the family in succeeding generations.
3. According to the grandfather Andrew Miller's will (See reference 1 above), Andrew Miller, #1 of this family group, was William's eldest son. The will also states that if Andrew does not survive his father William, the bequest to Andrew is to be sold and the money divided among all William's children. This proves conclusively that there were other children in this family group, however, their names are unknown. Possibly one of William Miller's children was Ann Miller who married Thomas Wilson 11 Mar 1796. Andrew Miller served as bondsman. NOTES

1. It is not established that all of Andrew Miller's children accompanied him to Mecklenburg County, NC; probably they did not.
2. According to the will of Matthew Rutledge, brother of Elizabeth (See reference 1 above), Elizabeth was still "Elizabeth Rutledge" at the writing of his will in 1748. Two of Matthew's other sisters were referred to by their married names. This suggests Elizabeth Rutledge and Andrew Miller married after February, 1748. Andrew Miller, Jr. witnessed Matthew's will. Probably this Andrew was the Andrew Miller, subject of this group sheet, who married Elizabeth Rutledge. Also Andrew Miller, subject of this family group was called Andrew Miller, Jr. in his 1742 land warrant (See reference 4 above). While this does not prove Andrew Miller, Jr's father was Andrew Miller, probably he was. Subsequently by the time of the writing of the will of Elizabeth Rutledge's father Isaac Rutledge 21 May 1760, Andrew Miller and Elizabeth Rutledge were married. This would place their marriage date between 1748 and 1760.

While it is possible all these warrants were not issued to the Andrew Miller of this study, those marked with an asterisk clearly were, as probably also were some of the remainder.

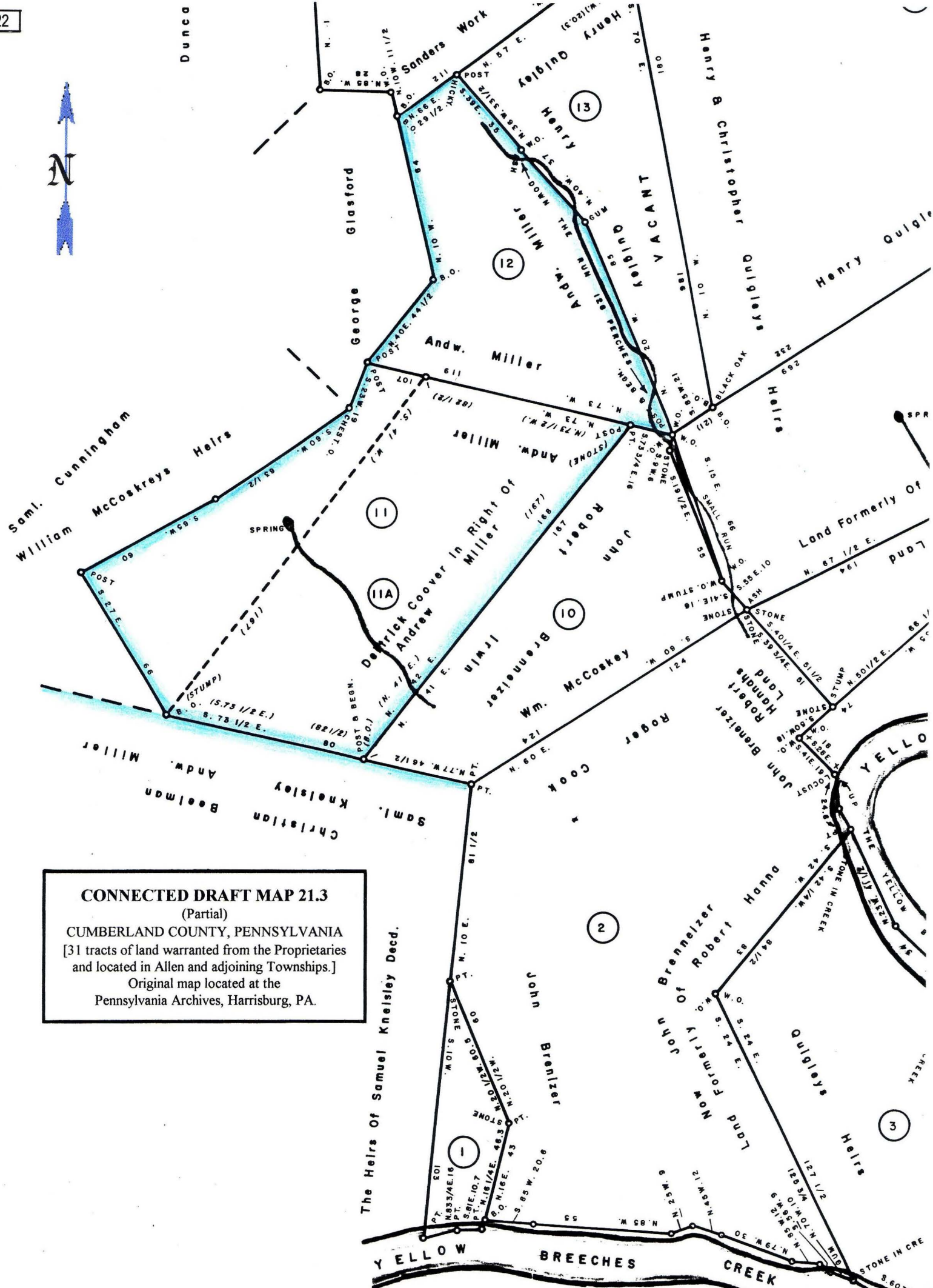
The land sold by Andrew and Elizabeth (Rutledge) Miller in Cumberland County Deed 1:C:428-430, 18 May 1772/5 January 1774 (see below), probably represented their homestead as one-half squared acre was retained by Andrew Miller for use as a graveyard. The graveyard must already have been in existence, since the Miller's move to North Carolina was imminent. This deed contains references to land patents from the Proprietaries bearing dates of 1742 and 1745.

In another transaction (Cumberland County, PA, Deed 1:L:354-356, 5 October 1772/15 June 1795) by the Millers preparatory to their move to North Carolina, the land is described as having been acquired by two warrants from the Proprietaries. The dates of the warrants referred to in the deed match the dates of the last 2 warrants listed. The second parcel in this deed corresponds exactly with Tract 12 on the Connected Draft Map for warranted land in Allen and adjoining Cumberland County Townships. The first parcel corresponds descriptively to the eastern portion of Tract 11-11A; the dates of the warrants, however, are not in agreement.

The deed itself contains a stipulation that the sale is "subject to the remainder of the purchase money, interest and quit rents due and to become due to the honorable Proprietaries . . ." Thus it would appear that the land was not free from encumbrances, i.e., that Andrew Miller had not completed the process of payment and obtaining a patent for the land and was in effect selling the warrant rights he had obtained two years earlier. This is further evidenced from the low purchase price of the land.

An additional land transaction by the Millers can be found in Cumberland County Deed 1:M:383, 14 September 1772/20 November 1797.

The Pennsylvania Archives has not compiled a complete warrant map for Cumberland County which would show the location of all the tracts listed in the published *Pennsylvania Archives* as having been warranted to Andrew Miller.
