 We Thomas & William C. Winfrey as principal and Riley Winfrey as securites are held and bound to the State of Missouri in the sum of four thousand dollars, for the payment of which we bind our selves our heirs executor and administrators. The condition of the above bound is that if Thomas & William C. Winfrey, Administrators of the estate of James Winfrey, deceased, shall faithfully administer said estate account for pay and deliver all money and property of said estate, and perform all other things touching said administration required by law or the law of any court having jurisdiction then the above bond to be paid, otherwise to remain in full force and effect. Witness whereof and have hereunto subscribed our names and affixed our seals the 6th day of May 1864.

 All heirs listed are selling on a quit claim deed or their undivided interest in the same piece of property to James M. Wiseman. This piece of property being the SW fraction quarter and the South half of Lot 1 of the South West quarter of Section 7 Township 38 of Range 14.

This is the same land for which James Winfrey received a government land patent on 1 November 1848. The grantors represent the living heirs of James Winfrey. For a listing, see page 12-26 of this volume.

It is regrettable the original of James Winfrey's inventory is so faded. The importance of the document is that it enumerates his real estate holdings. As James left no will, the disposition of his land serves to identify his heirs. Most of the buyers at the sale of James's possessions were his children and grandchildren.
