1. A George Graul/Krawl held the rank of captain in various Battalions of the Berks County, PA, Militia during the Revolutionary War as per the *Pennsylvania Archives, Second Series* 19 vols., comps. John B. Linn and William H. Egle (Harrisburg: Commonwealth of Pennsylvania [B.F. Meyers, State Printer], 1874-1895), 14:298; and *Fifth Series*, 8 vols., comp. Thomas L. Montgomery (Harrisburg: Commonwealth of Pennsylvania [Harrisburg Publishing Co.], 1906-1907), 5:130; 5:137 and 5:198. It is not known if he were the George Graul of this study.
2. Elizabeth was the wife of George Grauel at the time of the execution of the deed cited in reference 5 above. This does not constitute proof that she mothered all of his children.
3. A Jacob Graul married Mary Fitch (widow of Wallace Fitch) 24 August 1834 as per reference 4 above.. It is not known if he were this Jacob Graul.

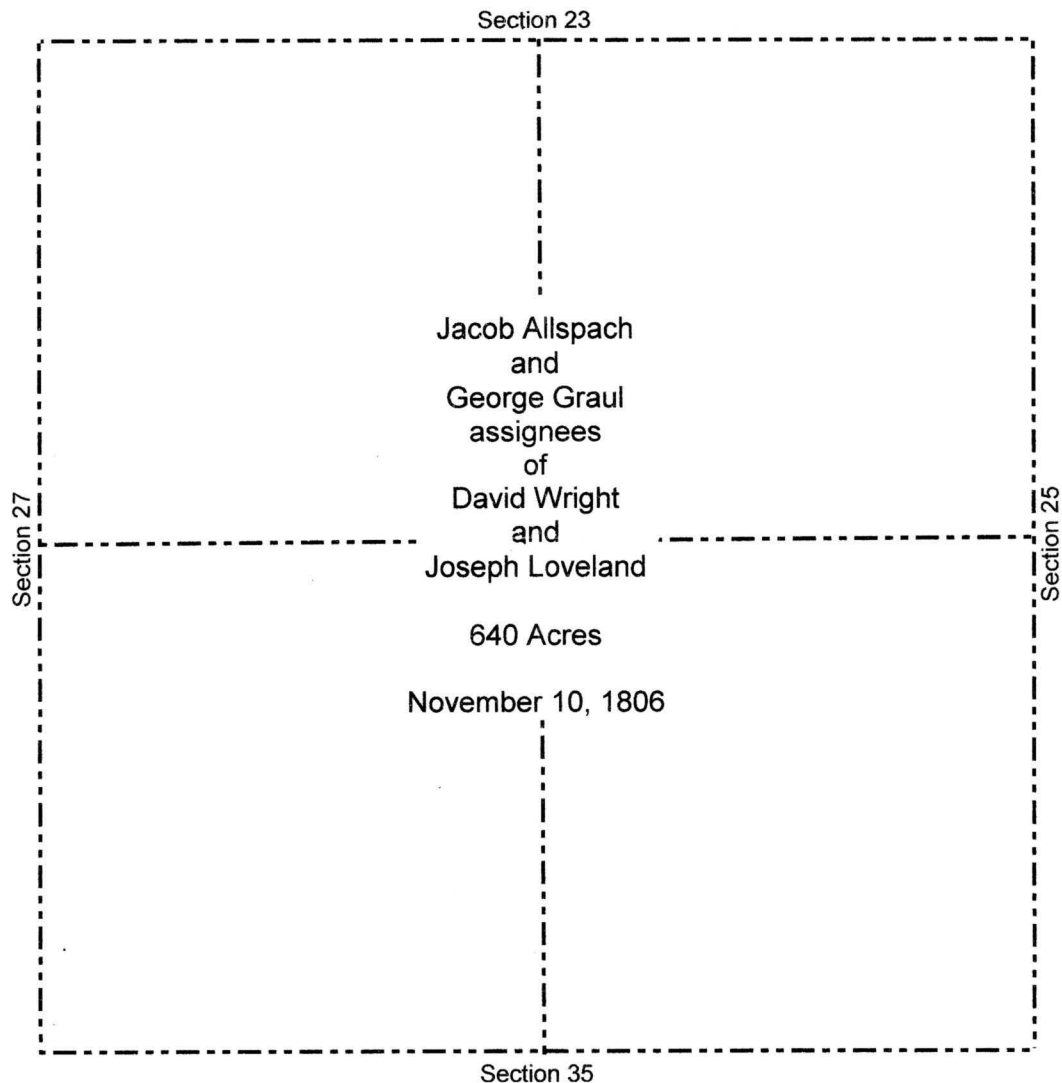

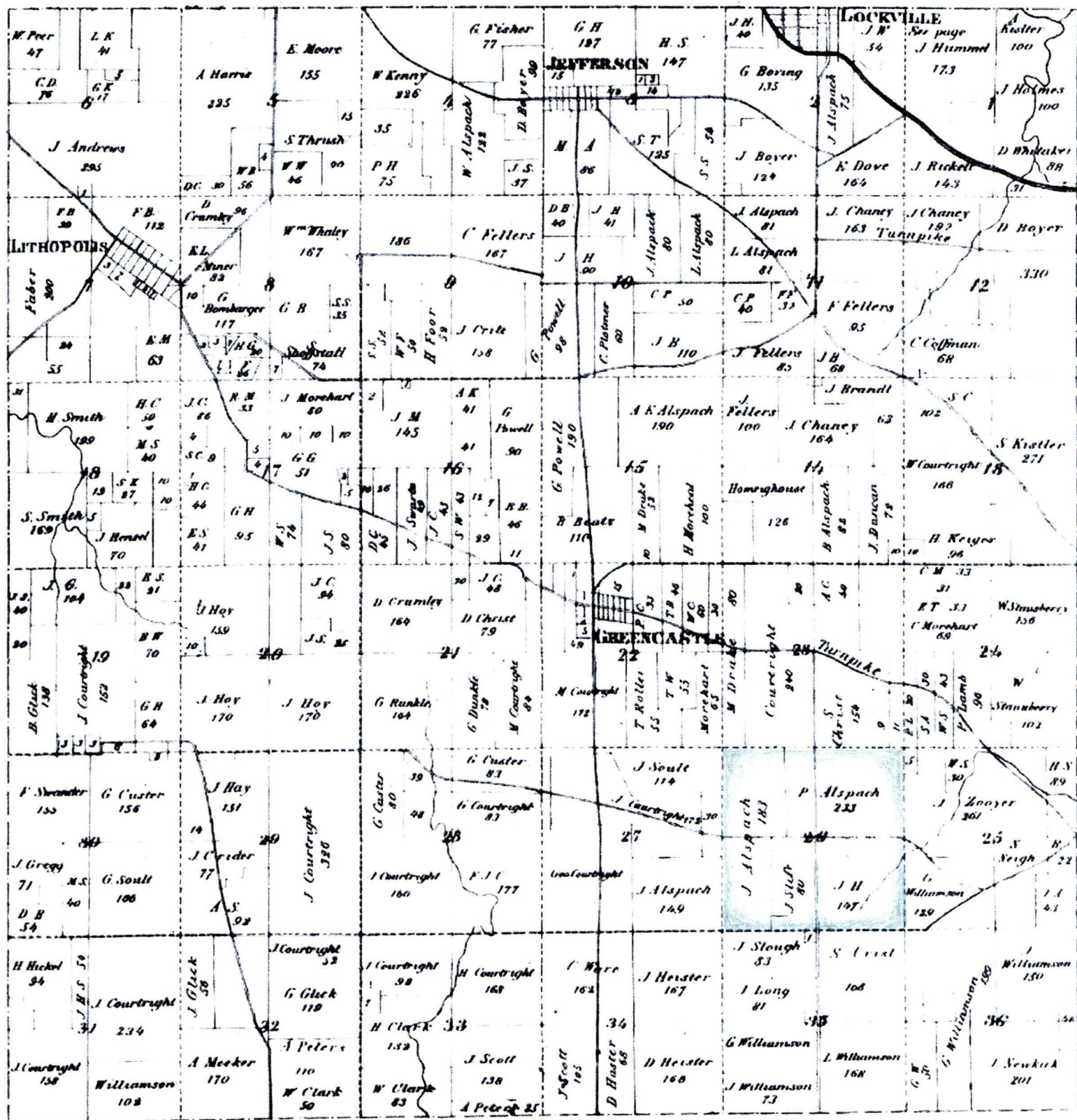

By 1866, the Graul name is missing from the Bloom Township map, although the Alspach family is still in possession of the land acquired in 1806 in partnership with George Graul. According to the map the Alspach family has added considerably to its holdings.
