YORK COUNTY, PA, ORPHAN'S COURT RECORDS
ESTATE OF JACOB WEIDLER

The following York County, Pennsylvania, Orphan's Court records were generated by the death on 2 April 1814 of Jacob Weidler, innkeeper of Shrewsbury Township. Jacob died intestate leaving a widow and eight minor children. The widow Elizabeth Weidler of York County, and her brother Henry Carpenter of Lancaster County were appointed administrators of Jacob's estate. Jacob Keiser (unrelated) and Elizabeth Weidler were named guardians of the six youngest children.

Jacob Weidler's liquid assets were inadequate to settle his debts, and the court ordered that sufficient of his real estate be exposed to sale to satisfy these obligations. Elizabeth Weidler and Henry Carpenter continued to administer the estate until December, 1820, at which time Henry appeared before the court alone. Elizabeth may have been in poor health at that time because she succumbed in December of the following year at the age of forty-four. On 14 May 1822 Henry Carpenter filed the final account of the administration showing a balance of ten hundred thirty six dollars and three cents.

The Petition of Henry Carpenter and Elizabeth Weidler Administrators of all and singular the goods and Chattels rights and Credits Which were of Jacob Weidler late of Shrewsbury Township in the said County deceased Who died Intestate — Was read to the Court setting forth. that the said Intestate hath left to survive him a Widow the said Elizabeth, and eight Children all minors, That he died seized in his demise of fee of a certain Plantation of about One hundred and Ten Acres in said Township on which he resided and also of another Tract of Fifty Acres more or less, adjoining the Dwelling place and Abraham Billharts place, Which the deceased purchased of Jacob Hawk, That the Personal Estate of Intestate according to the Account this day settled and confirmed is insufficient to pay the Debts of the Intestate, there being on said Account a Balance of Ninety Dollars, thirty Cents due to the Administrators and others debts being yet due for payments of Which there are no personal assets —

* Henry Carpenter and Elizabeth Wiedler Administrators of Jacob Wiedler, deceased Made report to the Court in the Words following to Wit - To the Honourable the Judges of the Orphans Court - Henry Carpenter and Elizabeth Wiedler, Administrators of Jacob Wiedler deceased to whom was directed an Order of said Court to Sell part of the real Estate of said deceased, report that after due and legal notice first given of the time and place of sale, they did expose to sale the said real Estate at public sale in Lots, and part of the same was then and there sold as follows to Wit, Lot number one containing one hundred perches neat measure was sold unto Hugh Hood for the sum of fifty nine Dollars thirty seven cents, Lot number two containing two acres thirty perches, neat measure, was also sold to Hugh Hood for one hundred Ninety seven Dollars, Lot number four containing two acres twenty perches neat measure was sold to Hugh Hood and John Bottner for one hundred seventy two Dollars twelve cents And lot Number five containing five acres was sold to John Shires for four Hundred forty five Dollars, The residue of said lands was unsold. And the terms of said sales were one half in hand on the first day of March next and remainder on the first day of April A.D. 1817 - Witness our hands, October 28th 1815 Henry Carpenter
