The document, Deed F:5:295, assures the correct line of descent of Reuben Weidler from his grandparents Jacob and Anna (Weibrecht) Weidler through his father Jacob Weidler.

As per the will of Anna Weidler (Lancaster County, PA, Will Book M:1:524-525, 3 August 1820/30 April 1821), widow of Jacob Weidler of Manheim Township, Lancaster County, PA, a bequest was assigned to the children of her deceased son, Jacob. The following deeds represent the releases executed by Anna's eight grandchildren by her son Jacob to the executor of Anna's will who was her other son, John Weidler.
