


<p>27. history, significance and/or background</p> <p>This house is usually identified as that built for the residence of <u>Martin Weybrecht (Waybright)</u> in 1741. The surrounding land was warranted to Weybrecht on January 19, 1733. Weybrecht, an early settler in this part of the County, evidently was a person of some prominence and wealth for the time and place. For example, he gave the extant German pewter flagon to Lancaster's Lutheran Church of the Holy Trinity in the early 1730's.</p> <p>(continued)</p>

PHOTOGRAPHS

1. Anno 1733, Johann Martin Weybrecht donated this pewter flagon with cover and spout, and below 3 feet, on each of which is an angel's head. It holds nearly 2 quarts. There is a little lamb with a banner on the cross engraved thereupon, with 3 initials I.C.S. The flagon was done by Heinrich Mueller of Rothenburg, Germany.
2. This pewter flagon is attributed to William Will, ca 1780-1790.
3. Pair of pewter flagons made by the Lancaster pewterer J. Christopher Heyne. Heyne was born in Saxony 1715 and died in Lancaster in 1781.
4. Pewter baptismal bowl. Date unknown.




The form of the flagon made by Heinrich Müller (Figure 195) was used by pewterers in southern Germany, including Bavaria and Switzerland. The ball thumbpiece, pointed spout, strap handle, body form, and cherub's head feet are indigenous to this region. Lancaster pewterer Johann Christoph Heyne used this flagon style with its ball thumbpiece as a prototype for similar vessels he made that are owned by the same congregation. The mark on the handle of the

Müller flagon (Figure 196) clearly shows the date (1712) and includes castles that were the secondary city mark used by makers in Rothenburg ob der Tauber. The date in the mark suggests that Müller began his career as a pewterer in 1712. Hintze lists 1721 as the beginning of Müller's working period but does not illustrate a mark. Ludwig Schnurrer's *Das Zinngießerhandwerk in Rothenburg ob der Tauber* lists Müller but found no marked examples.³⁵
